Awareness on Coronavirus in Villages & Rural Healthcare through 3 Mobile Health Vans

PI Foundation in collaboration with GVK-EMRI is implementing Swasthya Seva through 3 Mobile Medical Vans that supports more than one lakh population from remote 64 villages of Jambusar.

Our Swasthya Seva ensures access to quality healthcare and has impacted over One lakh people residing in remote location of Jambusar taluka. This has reduced the financial burden on health expenditure for poor families.

PI Foundation is utilising these Mobile Medical Units 24x7 in 64 villages of Jambusar, Gujarat for spreading awareness on the necessity of social distancing and hand-sanitisation through instruction leaflets. The services are extended for conducting thermal screening, distributing masks and other necessities to villagers.

Reviving Cotton Production PROJECT and Increasing Growers' Income in India through Eco-friendly PB Knot Technology

PI Foundation in collaboration with The South Asia Biotechnology Centre (SABC) & Roots Foundation has been implementing an innovative and multi-stakeholder 'PROJECT BANDHAN: A Knot of PBW Protection' to embrace cutting-edge innovation by tagging the environmental friendly PB Knot technology to protect the cotton plant from devastating PBW (Pectinophora gossypiella).

Pink Bollworm (PBW) is one of the major pests of cotton in India. Its infestation is a big menace to cotton cultivation in cotton growing regions of the country. Cotton growers from across the country have to incur huge yield loss due to PBW infestation. 'Project Bandhan' is an exemplary initiative to promote pheromone based IPM production system of cotton. The project involves adopting villages to showcase IPM Package of practices and implement mating disruption technology on a mass scale to control Pink Bollworm (PBW).

As part of the CSR initiative, PI Foundation is keen to support the area wide implementation of Project Bandhan and is committed to sustainable agriculture and environmental protection in 2022-23.

Employability-linked Skill Development Centre at Jambusar

PI Foundation along with Rural Shores has been running a Skill Development Centre in Jambusar. At the Centre, unemployed and underprivileged youth are trained with vocational training courses across various sectors to generate employment after their course completion. New trade as 'electrician' has been introduced this year and has replaced 'food & beverage service stewards' basis the post-covid assessment of potential employment opportunities in nearby areas. The courses are for 3 months (Min 500 hrs. per trainee) with an annual intake of 400 students.

PI Foundation Skill Development Centre has been running smoothly with strict adherence to COVID protocol. We saw a total of 118 students enrolling in 2022-23 and continuing their courses in Advanced Excel, BPO and Electrician course.

Improving Learning Outcomes in 135 Govt. Elementary Schools of Jambusar

PI Foundation in collaboration with Pratham Education Foundation has been implementing a CSR project to improve learning outcomes of over 12000 children enrolled in Govt. Elementary Schools located in 82 villages of Jambusar Block. The project envisages age & grade-appropriate learning standards for students in 135 schools of Jambusar taluka in Bharuch district.



Highlights during the month

- Follow-up camp completed by Cluster Resource Leader (CRL)
- Summer camp training
- Science community activities
- Library Group running in all villages

Follow-up Camp:

- Follow-up camps are running in 24 schools after completion of 40 days Learning Camp
- 2 to 3 week follow-up camp completed on word and Para Level Children's in 24 schools
- 208 children actively participating in the process

Summer Camp Training:

- Summer camp training conducted at Jagana Palanpur place with all CIM
- Language and math activities are running under summer camp involving children from Std 4 to 6. 1 hour on language and 1 hour on math is deployed every day

Science Activities:

- Sky watching completed under 7 villages with 158 children of Std 6 to 8. 174 parents also attented sky watching
- Summer camp running in 18 villages with 289 children from Std 6 to 8. Activities conducted around solar bulb, water filter, solar cooker and clean water





Library Group Activities:

- Library Group running under 82 villages through volunteers
- Total 398 Groups actively participated. Total 1912 children covered from Std 3 to 8

ASMITA Project - Women Empowerment through Improved Access to Credit and Livelihood Initiatives in 20 Villages

ASMITA project is being implemented with an aim to form and strengthen Self-help Groups (SHGs) of women for creating a sustainable base for microfinance activity in 20 villages- 15 villages of Jambusar (Sarod, Nodhna, Uber, Vedach, Samoj, Kavali, Nahar, Kangam, Amanpur, Tundai, Kareli, Kanhva, Piludra, Nobar & Bhodar) and 5 villages of Panoli area (Panoli, Sanjali, Kapodara, Bakrol & Umarwada).

Coronavirus pandemic created an opportunity to test the resilience of the leadership and systems. Following interventions were done during the month in Jambusar.

• Strengthening of SHGs: Monthly meetings of 125 groups were conducted and 1114 SHG members participated in the meeting. The meetings entailed discussions on regularity of conducting meetings, savings, loan repayments, updating records and linking members with Insurance & Govt. schemes

- Status of Savings: 125 groups accumulated total savings of ₹2.07 lac
- Status of Loan Accessed: 11 women from 5 villages accessed loans amounting to ₹2,55,000. This month's loan was majorly availed for Animal Husbandry. 10 SHG women renewed their Joint Liability Group Loan of ₹2,00,000

• Highlights of Panoli

Monthly meetings of 88 groups were conducted covering 993 SHG members. The meetings entailed discussions on the regularity of conducting meetings, savings, loan repayments, and linking members with insurance schemes.

All groups that received loans through Mahila Utkarsh Yojana were informed about repaying the loan amount by depositing ₹1,000 per month. Groups that had opened their bank accounts were advised to submit necessary documents in the Taluka for receiving revolving funds.



Status of Savings & Loan

- 80 groups collected a total saving of ₹1,12,000
- A total loan amount of ₹73,500 was availed by 11 women. The major loan was availed for initiating education, health & marriage purposes

Linkages with Govt. Schemes

35 SHG women were linked with Govt. schemes. Forms were filled for Ayushyman Card, E - shram Card, and Widow Pension and submitted to the Government offices. Information about 'Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima' and 'Pradhan Mantri Jivan Jyoti Bima' was also shared with members

Economic Empowerment of Women Smallholders and Workers through Improved Agriculture and Inclusive Dairy Value Chain Promotion

PI Foundation along with CARE India is implementing a project titled 'Improved Agriculture and Inclusive Dairy Value Chain Promotion' (IAIDVC-II) in 59 villages of Jambusar block of Bharuch district in Gujarat. The project is working with 3,369 women smallholders through 293 Self Help Groups (SHGs) and 6 cluster level federations. The goal of the project is to enhance the economic empowerment of women smallholders and landless workers through improved agriculture, livestock, and inclusive dairy value chain promotion.

Strengthening of SHGs and Federation

• Saving meetings are the core of SHG. Project team ensures regular saving meetings are held following all rules and regulations. This month 220 SHG saving meetings were attended by field team members

• Federations: The preparation for block level federation has been initiated through regular deep discussions among SHG members every 10 days. As a result of the continuous discussions regarding federation membership fee and service charges, ₹19,230/- have been collected by cluster level federations which will be deposited in the block level federation account once it is formed

5 cluster level general meetings have been organized at cluster level federations to share updates and create awareness on block level federation.

One of the cluster level federations "Tirth Sakhi Sangh" has established a Tailoring training unit at village Thanava. Project has supported the federation with 3 sewing machines. 15 women from surrounding villages are coming for training to the Centre. The federation is charging a fee of ₹500 per person / month to the trainees with the aim of earning revenue and also providing the opportunity of skill training at an affordable cost. Girls and women of surrounding villages are unable to travel to Jambusar due to lack of transportation, social issues, time consuming travel etc.

Sita Sakhi Sangh of Maalpur village has initiated the business of a Flour Mill and Masala Unit with project support.

Exposure Visit:

 Two team members visited Anubhuti Foundation in Pune to observe and learn about their food production unit. The team is planning that one of the cluster level federations would establish a similar business for production of Jamun Jam and other Jamun products



Linkages Strengthened with Government Department:

6 representatives of 5 cluster level federations visited the District Development Officer (DDO) and Collector of Bharuch. They have given an application to the officers regarding the issues SHG members are facing in dealing with banks.

Savings and Loan:

• ₹2.61 lac was the monthly saving of 273 SHGs in this month, cumulatively total saving of 293 SHGs till date is ₹1,40,22,462/-. ₹1,39,000/- has been accessed by 26 SHG members as an internal loan. The purpose of taking loan was mainly purchasing agriculture input material, cattle feed, goat purchase, starting small petty shop and medical help etc.

Bank linkages: 26 applications for Cash Credit limit have been submitted to Taluka Panchayat in this month

Capacity Building Trainings:

In this month capacity building trainings in Financial Literacy, Leadership & Management Training and Vision Building exercise was conducted with SHG members. Apart from this, trainings for Agri leaders and Dairy entrepreneurs were organized.

- TOT for cluster coordinators and change agents have been organized on grading, sorting, and marketing of wheat crop and cattle care in summer season
- 119 Agri leaders have been given training by cluster coordinators and change agents on the topics covered in TOT
- 25 Pashu Palak Pathshala have been organized to create awareness on best practices of goat / cattle rearing and promote Pashu Sakhi work
- 20 Gender dialogues have been facilitated with 200 couples using the gender dialogue toolkit
- The team including Cluster level and Village level SHG guides has undergone a 3-day gender training by CARE Gender Expert - Ms. Lata Krishnan. The training covered reflections on implementing gender dialogue toolkit, social norms, gender based violence, responsive feedback mechanism and interaction with federation members

Goat - An Income Source for Rural Women:

Manjulaben Chunara, a landless woman from village Kaliyari in Jambusar block of Bharuch district, depended on labour work to earn for the family of 12 before she joined an SHG named Sahajanad formed by PI Foundation and CARE India in January 2019. She took an internal loan of ₹10,000/- from her group in December 2019 and purchased 2 goats. She learned good practices of goat rearing by participating in Bakri Palak Pathshala organized by the project team. She adopted the practices she learned and now she has 15 goats! She earned ₹50,000/- on last Bakrid by selling 4 goats. She could repay the loan in time and now she is preparing male goats to sell on the next Bakrid and expecting to earn around ₹1,00,000/-
