PI Foundation in collaboration with GVK-EMRI is implementing Swasthya Seva through 3 Mobile Medical Vans that support more than one lakh population from 64 remote villages of Jambusar.

PI Foundation and its partners continuously organise awareness sessions on precautions against COVID-19 and waterborne diseases around Jambusar and Panoli. Mobile Health Van staff spread the messages among community members and beneficiaries come to avail the health services by providing updated information.

Screening of 75 labourers is happening once a week around our plant in Jambusar.

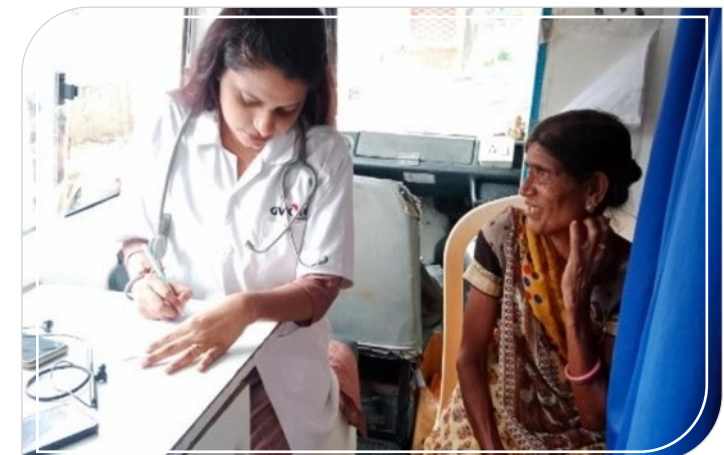

Project Vriddhi - Improved Health and Nutrition Status of Children & Adolescents

PI Foundation in collaboration with Institute for Global Development (IGD) has been implementing Project Vriddhi to create an integrated model for improved health and nutrition status of children and adolescents based on a continuum of intensive care approaches in Jambusar block of Bharuch district.

Objectives:

- Identify and intervene with vulnerable children and adolescents for health and nutritional impact.
- Involve adolescents and peer groups to bring about behavior change with a special focus on health and nutrition.
- Enhance the knowledge and skill sets of all caregivers, healthcare providers, ICDS functionaries, and school teachers towards improving the health and nutritional status of children and adolescents.

- Facilitate educational institutions to promote health and nutritional guidance.
- Promote peer leadership to spread health awareness among the target group affecting social behavioral change and its application.
- Engage with all key stakeholders including parents and community members through advocacy and liaison for appropriate social and behavioral changes in different activities of health and nutrition.





Highlights of the Month

- Medical health screening of children, adolescents, and pregnant and lactating women continued, to identify basic health issues such as nutritional deficiency organized in Anganwadi centres of 16 villages.

A total number of 84 beneficiaries were identified in 3 Anganwadis. 63 Anganwadis in 16 villages are covered under the program. Moving forward with the process of providing nutrition supplementation to the identified SAM and MAM children, a visit was made to the Child Malnutrition Treatment Centre (CMTc) at Block level to understand their role in

the supplementation programme. It was learned that the state government has been providing supplementation services to children. SUMUL has a product line having F75 and F100 for SAM children and for MAM children specially developed nutritious cookies are available. Assistance will be provided in sponsoring the nutrition supplementation program for identified SAM and MAM children on these lines.

- As part of Poshan Abhiyan, September is observed as **Poshan Maah** every year. This month highlights the importance and role of right nutrition for the human body. The theme for Poshan Maah 2022 is 'Mahila aur Swasthya and Bacha aur Shiksha'. Primary schools and Anganwadi centres were visited and sessions were conducted on nutrition through fun activities.





Locations covered in the Poshan Maah Campaign:

- Primary School, Mota Amanpor
- Primary School, Bhodar
- Anganwadi centres of Piludara 2 & 3, Tundaj, Bhodar 1, Bhodar-2, Nobar, Sarod 4 – 6
- During Poshan Maah, our intervention with adolescents in Mobile Nutritional Guidance Centres (MNGCs) was also initiated. The purpose of these MNGCs is to address the need of children and adolescents going to school as well as interact with dropout children and adolescents (not going to school) and to build leadership among them. To break the intergenerational cycle of malnutrition, the focus is to challenge adolescent malnutrition.
- An expert Nutritionist conducted the behavioural change communication session in two schools - Mota Amanpur and Bhodar. A total of 254 students and teachers participated in the sessions in the Mobile Nutrition Guidance Centre. The behavioural change communication was typically focused on improved nutrition practices such as promoting balanced diets and the improved use of locally available foods to ensure increased intake of important nutrients.

Components of Mobile Nutrition Guidance Centre activities:

- Awareness generation on Preventive & Curative action against Malaria, Dengue & Diarrhea.
- Sessions with students on Menstrual Health & Hygiene
- Awareness of required Nutrition & Supplementation for the human body. For example: Iron & Folic Acid, Iodine in Iodized salt, Zinc, Calcium, Vitamin A.
- Making students aware of Sexual Transmitted Diseases (STDs)
- Education on Sexual, Reproductive & Maternal Health (SRM) for the age group of 10-19 years.





Free Health Camp on Gynaecology & Reproductive Child Health at Public Health Centre, Tankari, Jambusar

PI Foundation organized the free Health Camp on Gynaecology and Reproductive Child Health. The venue of the camp was at Public Health Centre, Tankari, Jambusar. The Health Camp was inaugurated by Shri Sanjay Solanki, Honble MLA, Jambusar. Medical Officers, PHC- Tankari, Sarpanch, Tankari & Community leaders from surrounding villages participated in the camp and applauded the efforts made by PI Foundation. Gynaecologist from Sub Division Hospital, Jambusar lead the operation.

The camp is aimed to contribute towards specialized health care for women. Information, Education and Communication (IEC) activity was carried out prior to the scheduled camp date. The camp facilitated to provide free ANC & PNC check-up for women. More than 175 women from surrounding villages benefitted-availed the diagnosis, Lab facilities and free medicines along with the consultation. 9 women were identified in high risk ANC.





Reviving Cotton Production and Increasing Growers' Income in India through Eco-friendly PB Knot Technology



PI Foundation in collaboration with the South Asia Biotechnology Centre (SABC) has been implementing an innovative and multi-stakeholder 'PROJECT BANDHAN: A Knot of PBW Protection' to embrace cutting-edge innovation by tagging the environmentally-friendly PB Knot technology to protect the cotton plant from devastating PBW (*Pectinophora gossypiella*).

PI Foundation's 'Project Bandhan - A Knot of PBW Protection' has expanded its footprint across all three cotton growing zones with successful completion of tagging of PB Knot mating disruption of pink bollworm in 19 clusters spread over 16 districts in India. Project Bandhan is supported countrywide by PI Foundation and implemented in a true public and private partnership with large numbers of institutions including South Asia Biotechnology Centre (SABC), Dr. PDKV Akola, College of Agriculture Amravati, KVK Wardha, KVK Yavatmal, KVK Buldana, KVK Karimnagar, Ambuja Cement Foundation, AFPRO and FPO Parthipadu Farmers

Producer Company Limited and Markapuram Divya Teja Farmers Producer Company Ltd. and PI Industries Ltd.

Spread over 16 districts, field demonstration over 1281.4 acres in 19 clusters is the country's largest to educate farmers about the effective management of pink bollworm. Each field demonstration showcases PB Knot mating disruption with a series of on-field meetings, small group meetings, on-farm farmers mela, visits of officials and media to create a multiplier effect.

Project Bandhan's field team with expertise in cotton production has been regularly organizing weekly meetings in small and large groups for farmers to inform and familiarize participating farmers and visitors with the PB Knot technology.

PB Knot cluster fields are regularly being monitored and timely advice given on appropriate measures to control the infestation of sucking pests. Farmers have been enrolled in each of the identified clusters in Northern, Central & Southern India - in Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan, Gujarat, Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh and Telangana. A team of highly trained field staff has been rigorously monitoring PBW lifecycle, symptoms & management, PB Knot technology and tagging methodology and data collection on a weekly basis across all PB Knot clusters.

Intensive Training of Farmers, FPO and RAWE students

PB Knot clusters in different cotton growing areas have intensified on-farm training of farmers and FPO and engaged agriculture students under RAWE programs at KVK, Yavatmal; KVK, Karimnagar; AFPRO, Yavatmal; Effort at Prakasham; ACF at Amerli, Gujarat; FPO Parthipadu Farmers Producer Company Limited, Guntur and Markapuram Divya Teja Farmers Producer Company Ltd at Prakasham.

Farmers, FPOs and RAWE students participated in

- On-farm training programs
- Conducted tagging of PB Knot
- Engaged in data collection
- Farmers-student exchange program involving FPOs at Guntur and Prakasham allowed Project Bandhan to expand the reach and learning of PB Knot technology in villages across PB Knot demonstration.

Monitoring and Data recording activities

All PB Knot clusters in North, Central and South India have been under close supervision and monitoring under the technical guidance of an expert team of Project Bandhan - Dr. Dilip Monga, Mr. Deepak Jakhar, Dr. PDKV and Dr. Narava Ramana. The monitoring is also supported by the regular visits of entomologists from Punjab Agricultural University (PAU) Ludhiana and a team from PI Industries including Shri Dushyant Sood and Shri Vijay Pal Godara.

The expert team has been regularly visiting each PB Knot plot and has trained manpower at each PB Knot cluster with collection of multivariate dataset including the recording of moth catches of PBW from installed pheromone traps, weekly rosette flower, locule damage and green boll damage. The analysis of primary moth catches data indicates a robust negligible presence of PBW moth in the treated plot in comparison to control plots in all PB Knot clusters across India.

Team Project Bandhan demonstrated, mimicking the live field conditions of PBW infestation, in Krishi Mela 2022 organized by Chaudhary Charan Singh Haryana Agricultural University (CCSHAU) on September 13-14, 2022.

The PB Knot mating disruption exhibit was a center point of attraction. The exhibit not only showcased PB Knot technology but also displayed live samples of PBW, live cotton plants of infected and treated plots, installed pheromone traps and live tagging of PB Knot in the presence of hundreds of farmers.

The exhibition also organized a quiz competition, enrolled farmers and awarded gifts in the form of pheromone traps to participating farmers. The live counter of PB Knot was the major attraction of farmers, students and researchers. The exhibition also hosted scientists, researchers and breeders and students of entomology department of CCSHAU, Hisar.

PB Knot LPD Update FY 22-23

Biggest ever LPD plan to cover ~7000 acres under PB Knot LPDs, across 9 cotton growing states, including Department of Agriculture, KVKs, Agri Universities.

- Partnering with seed companies: NSL, Mahyco, Rashi Seeds, Tata Rallis for PB Knot LPDs in their plots.

ASMITA Project - Women Empowerment through Improved Access to Credit and Livelihood Initiatives in 20 Villages

ASMITA project is being implemented with an aim to form and strengthen Self Help Groups (SHGs) of women for creating a sustainable base for microfinance activity in 20 villages- 15 villages of Jambusar (Sarod, Nodhna, Uber, Vedach, Samoj, Kavali, Nahar, Kangam, Amanpur, Tundaj, Kareli, Kahanva, Piludra, Nobar & Bhodar) and 5 villages of Panoli area (Panoli, Sanjali, Kapodara, Bakrol & Umarwada).

- **Strengthening of SHGs:** Monthly meetings of 126 groups were conducted in Jambusar and 1,124 SHG members participated. During the meetings, SHGs were counselled about registering in National Rural Livelihood Mission (NRLM) for availing of their benefits and progressing towards developing enterprises. SHG members were also requested to link their mobile numbers to Aadhaar as there were issues in the opening of bank accounts due to some mobile numbers not linking to Aadhaar

- 4 SHGs were registered with National Rural Livelihood Mission (NRLM) after bank account opening
- 9 new members joined the existing SHGs
- 4 SHGs were registered with National Rural Livelihood Mission (NRLM) after bank account opening
- **Saving:** Members of 126 SHGs deposited their savings amounting to ₹2,12,100 in Jambusar during the month.
 - Total savings of 126 Groups (till date): ₹94.43 lacs
 - Internal lending of Loan: ₹32.79 lacs
 - Total Cumulative Saving in FY 2022-23: ₹10.73 lacs



Highlights of Panoli

- Monthly meetings of 80 SHGs out of 82 groups were conducted covering 901 SHG members. The process for cash credit loans was discussed with the SHG members. Women from Bakrol and Sanjali were encouraged to initiate home composting as a step towards sustainable waste management. Along with this, they were counselled on regular recovery of loans received from NRLM and submitting documents at Taluka office for revolving fund.
- Saving:** Members of 80 SHG deposited their savings amounting to ₹1,11,300 in Panoli during the month.
 - Total savings of 80 Groups (till date): ₹25.71 lacs
 - Internal lending of Loan: ₹6.99 lacs
 - Total Cumulative Saving in FY 2022-23: ₹5.55 lacs
- Skill Training for Income Generation Activities**
Total of 12 SHG members from Jambusar received training for making house cleaning products such as phenyl, dishwashing liquid, detergent etc.
- SHG from Sanjali village participated in Bharuch Mela in which sales amounted to ₹1,000.

- Meeting was held with 51 members of Self Help Group by NRLM officials regarding training for enterprise development on paper bag making, jewellery making, where the participants will receive the certificates

Economic Empowerment of Women Smallholders and Workers through Improved Agriculture and Inclusive Dairy Value Chain Promotion

PI Foundation along with CARE India is implementing a project titled 'Improved Agriculture and Inclusive Dairy Value Chain Promotion' (IAIDVC-II) in 59 villages of Jambusar block of Bharuch district in Gujarat. The project is working with 3,369 women smallholders through 293 Self Help Groups (SHGs) and 6 cluster-level federations. The goal of the project is to enhance economic empowerment of women smallholders and landless workers through improved agriculture, livestock, and inclusive dairy value chain promotion.

Highlights of the Month - Federation Strengthening

Monthly Meeting of Block Level Federation: The process of strengthening the Block level federation is going on. The project is in the process of the federation's legal identity and registration. It has organized Block level federation monthly meetings, focused

federation's goal and common understanding. The project team has been working on the federation members' capacity building and different skills individually.

Members have been involved in the process from the initial stage to create a sense of ownership among them.

These women members have selected 11 committee members keeping in mind the criteria of selection. Along with this, they have selected members for the advisory committee including three male champions. The male champions are actively participating in the federation meetings and providing their support to the women. In addition to gender, skill development and marketing committee formation are underway.



6 Cluster level federation meetings with 54 committee members were held in 6 villages and one meeting with 6 Cluster level federations was held for idea sharing and planning.

Linkage Strengthening with Govt. Department – Taluka Development Office

The members of the block level federation visited Taluka Development Officer and shared the work being done by SHGs and the federation and requested support & guidance. Malpur cluster level federation got approval for the CIF Fund amount of ₹15 lacs in this month.

Internal Loan: ₹1,95,000 has been accessed by 20 SHGs members as an internal loan. The purpose of taking loan was mainly purchasing agriculture input material, cattle feed, goat purchases, starting a small petty shop and medical help, children's education, fisheries support in group enterprise etc.

Bank linkages: Federation and SHG members continued to follow up with the respective banks on the submitted application for cash credit loans for 24 SHGs and 5 applications for saving bank accounts. Among them, one SHG from village Kava received a cash credit of ₹1 lac.



Agriculture Activities

The project is planning to introduce the system of incentive / reward to selected progressive farmers who will adopt the improved POP in this Phase. The team has developed a farmer diary for record-keeping and assessment purposes. Farmer diary has been distributed to 500 cotton POP farmers to collect all the information.

Dairy Activities

6 successful Milk Collection Centers (MCCs) cum Center of Excellence were established to be further capacitated on regular basis to increase business. A learning cum sharing event was organized among these Centers. An event was also organized in Thanava village to recognize the best Milk Collection Center and an Award given to the Madafar MCC for this quarter. In order to communicate and disseminate dairy information and facilitate learning from one another, monthly meetings of Milk Collection Centers have been conducted with MCC members.

Income Generating Activities

- **Pashu Palak PathShala:** 20 Pashu Palak Pathshalas have been organized with 265 Cattle farmers.
- **Pashu Sakhi Cluster Meetings:** Pashu Sakhi cluster meetings have been organized with 15 Pashu Sakhis.
- **Master Trainer Training:** 15 women members trained as Master Trainers.

Certificate Distribution Ceremony

Tirth Sakhi Sangh Group established the Tailoring Training Unit in village Thanava. Federation members took ownership, managed

the premises on rent, decided the rules & divided roles and responsibilities. The purpose of the training unit was not only to earn but also to provide solutions to the challenges faced by the women and girls of surrounding villages. This month a certificate distribution program was organized by Tirth Sakhi Sangh in the Thanava village in which 15 participants received certificates.

3 Pashu Sakhi women completed 2 months of advance 'Pashu Mitra' training successfully, they got RSETI certificate from the LDM-Lead District Bank Manager and Bank of Baroda RSETI Director. Now they are planning to transfer the knowledge to other Pashu Sakhis in Jambusar block.





Employability-linked Skill Development Centre at Jambusar

PI Foundation along with Rural Shores has been running a Skill Development Centre in Jambusar. At the Centre, unemployed and underprivileged youth are trained in vocational training courses across various sectors to generate employment after their course completion. New trade as 'Electrician' has been introduced and has replaced 'Food & Beverage Service Stewards' basis the post-covid assessment of potential employment opportunities in nearby areas. The courses are for 3 months (Min 500 hrs. per trainee) with an annual intake of 400 students.

2nd Valedictory program was organized at the PI Foundation Skill Development Centre, Jambusar. Shri Pradeep Kumar Jain, Chief Operating Officer, PI Industries Ltd., Shri Kiran Makwana, Ex MLA of Jambusar and Sarpanchs of Sarod Vaata, Asanvad & Kavli along with representatives from PI Foundation graced this occasion and handed over Certificates to 72 successful students. Students got placement letters for jobs in the range of ₹7,500 - ₹11,500 salary.

PI Foundation Skill Development Centre has been running smoothly with strict adherence to COVID-19 protocol. Total 284 students were enrolled in 2022-23. 191 students completed their course and 130 students got placement. 93 students are continuing their courses in 'Advanced Excel', BPO, BFSI and Electrician trade.

Elementary Schools located in 82 villages of Jambusar block. The project envisages age & grade-appropriate learning standards for students in 135 schools of Jambusar taluka in Bharuch district.

Basic Learning Camp



- 40-day Learning Camp started in 18 schools for Std. 3 to 5.
- 10-day second learning camp completed in 18 schools and 10-day second learning camp running in 9 schools.
- Under learning camp, 3 hours of Language & Math activities are running with targeted children by Community Instructors.





Light Activities



- Light activities are running with total of 923 children in Std. 1 & 2 in 18 schools. Community Instructors organize these activities for an hour
- Basic Math and Language activities are being organized with all children under Light activities
- Community Instructors also organize Balgeet and fun activities with children

Library Group Activities



- Library groups are running in 82 villages through volunteers
- Total of 405 groups actively participated in Library activities. Total 2051 children covered from Std. 3 to 8- 1088 children covered from Std. 3 to 5 and 963 children covered from Std. 6 to 8
- Community Instructors provided day-wise material to all 3 to 5 and 6 to 8 Library groups. Community Instructors also observe and support children and volunteers on regular basis

Advance Learning Camp



- 30-day advance learning camp started in 35 schools with Std. 6 to 8
- Community Instructors organize the Learning Camp activities based upon CAMaL methodologies. CIM is also organizing Math and Language activities with Std. 6 to 8 children for practice





Visit of Science Centre



- 158 Children and 6 Teachers from five schools- Jumma Masjid Primay School Jambusar, Nondhna Primay Schools, Amanpur Mota Primary School, Vavli Primary School and Bhodar Primary School visited the Science Center at Jambusar
- Total 68 models demonstrated and disseminated for practicals

Science Workshop



- 3-day Mela Manual Workshop finished in 80 schools by Vigyan Mitra for Std. 6 to 8
- 2,234 children participated in Mela Manual Workshop and prepared science models for 2 days
- Mini fair at the school level was also organized during the month with support from CIM and School teachers. A total of 39 models were presented at this fair. Total of 8,136 children observed this fair and also 946 parents & community members visited the fair
